The past 7 years she has worked as the Staff Attorney for the Eastern Divisions of the Tennessee Court of Appeals and Tennessee Court of Criminal Appeals. She also worked as a Staff Attorney for the Clerk's Office of the Supreme Court of Florida and as a Capital Case Attorney in Tennessee. After much discussion, City Attorney, Gregg Harrison, recommended Gary Fox to be appointed City Judge until the next August General State Election.
