The City Council met in its regularly scheduled meeting at 7:00 P.M. Mayor Tony Aikens and the following Councilmen were present: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler. Amber Scott and Jim Wilburn were also present.

Mayor Aikens presented a plaque to Herb Linginfelter in recognition of 19 years of serving on the Lenoir City Planning Commission.

Mayor Aikens asked for comments from citizens regarding an item/items on the agenda.

A motion was made by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Henline to approve the minutes of the September 12, 2016 meeting. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Mr. Henline and seconded by Mr. Hines to approve the Purchasing Committee's recommendation regarding advertising budget for Event Center in the amount of \$48,771.00. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Wampler to approve entering into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Lenoir City Utilities Board for use of a 1986 GMC Dump Truck. This is part of Grant Funds and it is not to exceed \$10,000.00. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Mr. Simpson and seconded by Mr. Shields to approve the Purchasing Committee's recommendation regarding War Memorial Building Project change requests including, insulate over existing roof and apply new metal roofing over insulation, furnish and install horizontal fire dampers, paint purlins, install basketball goal lift system, construct 15' wall in gymnasium area to hide conduit and air conditioning lines, remove carpet/add 2X8's/replace plywood facing on southeast side bleachers, painting of bleachers, at a total cost of \$70,037.66. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

Mayor Aikens asked for comments regarding item/items not on the agenda.  
Mr. Tyler Overstreet introduced himself as a candidate for State Representative.

A motion was made by Mr. Wampler and seconded by Mr. Johnson to approve all bills and accounts to be paid when properly approved and funds available. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.
