The Lenoir City Council met in a Public Hearing at 5:50 P.M. The purpose of the Public Hearing was for an Ordinance designating two (2) handicapped parking spaces in front of River Oaks Place Memory Care entrance on A Street in Lenoir City, Tennessee. The Lenoir City Council met in its regularly scheduled City Council Meeting at 6:00 P.M. Mayor Tony Aikens and the following Council Members were present: McNabb, Wampler, Kennedy, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson. Amber Scott Kelso, Walter Johnson, Jim Wilburn, Shawn Bunch, and LaVonne Barbour were also present.

A motion was made by Simpson and seconded by Brandon to approve the minutes of the August 25, 2025 meeting. The following vote was recorded: McNabb, Wampler, Kennedy, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**.

Mayor Aikens announced there will be a Special-Called Joint Workshop Meeting on Monday, September 15, 2025 at 3:00 P.M. with Lenoir City Board of Education to discuss borrowing money to build an addition at Lenoir City Intermediate Middle School. LCUB meeting will follow at 4:00 P.M. at City Hall (change of location for LCUB meeting).

Walter Johnson updated the board on pending litigation by Michael Adkisson who is suing 5 Star Waste for damage to the lid of his trash can.

Councilwoman McNabb announced that the committee for the warming/cooling centers will meet on October 20, 2025.

Councilman Kennedy expressed appreciation with the streambank stabilization project.

A motion was made by Kennedy and seconded by Shields to accept the agenda as written. The following vote was recorded: McNabb, Wampler, Kennedy, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**.

Mayor Aikens asked for comments from citizens regarding an item/items on the agenda.

A motion was made by Simpson and seconded by Shields to approve the Purchasing Committee's recommendation regarding bid for truck for use in the Street Department. The purchase is from Lenoir City Dodge Chrysler Jeep Ram for a total cost of \$49,999.00 for a 2025 Dodge Ram 2500. The following vote was recorded: McNabb, Wampler, Kennedy, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Simpson and seconded by Brandon to approve the Purchasing Committee's recommendation regarding purchase of used vehicle for Police Department and trade in vehicle. The purchase is a 2024 Dodge Durango from Lenoir City Dodge Chrysler Jeep Ram, for a total cost of \$19,500.00 with the trade in of a 2017 Ford Explorer. The following vote was recorded: McNabb, Wampler, Kennedy, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**.


Mayor Aikens asked for other comments from citizens regarding an item/items not on the agenda. Ms. Pat Hunter spoke on concerns with the landfill.


Mr. George Bove spoke about the upcoming Fall Street Festival and Car Show that will be held in downtown Lenoir City on Saturday, September 13, 2025.
