

October 11, 2021

The City Council of Lenoir City met in a Public Hearing at 5:55 P.M. The Public Hearing was for an Ordinance providing a Plan of Services for certain Properties proposed for annexation into the City of Lenoir City by Ordinance, pursuant to §6-51-102 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, said property being approximately 1.14 acres located at 264 and 386 Williams Ferry Road, furthermore identified as Loudon County Control Tax Map 10H, Group A, Parcels 004.00 and 005.00 being located within the Lenoir City Urban Growth Boundary. After the Public Hearing, the City Council of Lenoir City met in its regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, October 11, 2021 at 6:00 P.M. Mayor Aikens and the following Council Members were present: Henline, Hines, Wampler, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson. Amber Scott, Jim Wilburn, and Maggie Hunt were also present. City Attorney, Gregory Harrison was absent.

A motion was made by Brandon and seconded by Shields approving the minutes of the September 27, 2021 City Council meeting. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Wampler, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**.

Mayor Aikens asked for comments from citizens regarding an item/items on the agenda.

The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Wampler, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**.
Resolution 2021-10-11-2310-R.

A motion was made by Henline and seconded by Wampler approving a purchase from Duffield Aquatics in the amount of \$9,698.33 for an energy efficient cover for the Lenoir City Pool. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Wampler, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**. The other quotes are Lincoln Aquatics \$10,172.06, Campbell's Pools and Spa no quote, and The Great Backyard Place no quote.

A motion was made by Henline and seconded by Shields to add item #6 to the October 11, 2021 agenda to allow the Park & Recreation Director, Zack Cusick, permission to declare the old pool cover as Surplus Property and attempt to sell it on Gov Deals. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Wampler, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Brandon and seconded by Henline cancelling the November 22, 2021 and December 27, 2021 City Council Meetings. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Wampler, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Brandon and seconded by Simpson approving additional Christmas bonus in lieu of an Employee Christmas Luncheon. Full-time \$300.00 (\$200.00 in lieu of luncheon and \$100.00 regular Christmas bonus) and permanent part-time \$150.00. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Wampler, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Henline and seconded by Shields to allow the Park & Recreation Director, Zack Cusick, permission to declare the old pool cover as Surplus Property and attempt to sell it on Gov Deals. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Wampler, Shields, Brandon, and Simpson voting **AYE**.


Mayor Aikens asked for comments from citizens regarding an item/items not on the agenda.
